Ozaukee Humane Society

Main Entrance and Lobby

\$250,000

Visitors enter the facility through the Main Entrance and pass through the Lobby. This area serves as an educational and informational welcome to the various OHS departments that are located within the facility. It also includes donor recognition and entry to the veterinary clinic.

The Potty-O

\$50,000

Imagine a dog's delight in visiting the Potty-O, a patio of every dog's dreams! A one-of-a-kind collection of colorful, whimsical fire hydrants, this area will attract the attention of visitors, canine and human.

Building Exterior Portraits

\$15,000

Several cameos adorn the outside of the new OHS building. Designed to put a face to our mission and facility, these medallions, visible from the road, will bring the celebration of animals to the public. Participants in this special program can provide a photograph of an animal or work with OHS to have an appropriate photograph taken. An oil painting will be produced from the photograph, which will be used to create the cameo on the facility. The oil painting will be given to the donor.





Animal Adoption

Adoption Center

\$750,000

The Adoption Center is a colorful, whimsical place that will give visitors a greater awareness of the fun and excitement of the Ozaukee Humane Society. Educational displays are designed to encourage animal adoption, expand knowledge of animals and participation with the shelter. Adopters will be delighted at the special care that puppies, kittens, dogs, cats, rabbits, and other animals will be receiving in the new animal suites.

Information Kiosk

\$100,000

An instant magnet for visitors of all ages, the Information Kiosk will contain handy information about the shelter, program and services, great animal care tips, and more!

Cats may not find a mint on their pillow before bed, but the amenities are four star. Natural light, piped in music, plenty of socialization and the attention of all of our staff, volunteers and visitors make this a destination spot as cats and kittens wait to become part of loving, adoptive homes.

Dog Adoption

\$250,000

Dog Town is where all the action is for adoptable dogs (no cats allowed). This planned dog community has two neighborhoods each with their own park. Dog suites are spacious and allow dogs to entertain human guests, sleep comfortably in their own beds, and settle down with their blanket and favorite chew toy.

Canine Adoption Neighborhood I

\$50,000

Canine Adoption Neighborhood II

These two neighborhoods take on the unique character of their canine residents. Each neighborhood consists of seven residents, a park and a room where meals are prepared and guest records are maintained.

Canine Country Club I

Each dog neighborhood has a socialization or park area. The parks are attached to a complex of seven dog suites and allow dogs to receive basic training, socialize with other dogs, meet and greet new adoptive families and exercise, in addition to their scheduled outdoor walks with volunteers. This innovatively designed area provides a respite for shelter dogs to play and train.



Small Animal Boutique**\$20,000**

Rabbit, bird and small animal lovers are in their element in this intimate small mammal and bird haven housing for animals. All of the small mammals have an opportunity to play in their own playroom. Visitors are able to come and watch the bunnies romp through their tiny obstacle course under a sunny east window.

Small Animal Suites**\$500 each**

Each cage houses a lovely animal waiting for a new home. Each cage is guaranteed to attract inquisitive visitors each day to look at the adorable small animals. Dozens of rabbit socialization volunteers also visit these furry and feathered critters each week.

Animal Antics Retail Store**\$150,000**

The store that features assorted creature comforts for our furry friends is designed to be light hearted! New companion animal adopters complete their adoption in the retail store to ensure that they are prepared to take home their new family member. Animal Antics sells a variety of animal gear and logo merchandise and all proceeds benefit the shelter animals.

Canine Adoption Suite**\$5,000 each**

The heart of Dog Adoption is the individual dog suite – the place where our adoptable dogs reside while waiting to meeting their new guardians. The suites are spacious and allow dogs to entertain human families, nap on comfortable beds, or toss around a squeaky toy. Dog Town houses at least fourteen wagging canine guests patiently awaiting their new families.

Feline Adoption Suites**\$5,000 each**

The cat suites in Cat Nap are flooded with natural light and great views of the outdoors. Each suite provides enough space for a cat to stretch out, practice dancing steps, and even invite in a friend or two to get better acquainted. Big enough to entertain, the suite will allow a cat or a litter to feel comfortable.

Adoption Counseling Rooms**\$25,000 each**

Individuals and families receive a variety of information and resources to be better guardians to their new companions. Their first meeting with an OHS adoption counselor will enable new adopters to tap into the network of services provided by OHS. The counseling offices provide a private environment to review the records of the new animal and learn all about the joys and responsibilities involved with bringing home a new companion.

Volunteer Work Area**\$20,000**

A treasured resource, our hundreds of volunteers contribute their time and talents to OHS every single day. The volunteer area is a special place for volunteers to check in, learn about OHS announcements, keep up-to-date on events and new protocols, as well as access information about volunteer opportunities.





Veterinary Clinic

Veterinary Clinic

\$500,000

Community members can be confident in the caliber of services available through the state-of-the-art veterinary clinic, led by a full-time, dedicated veterinarian. The clinic will not only provide everything from lifesaving medical care to routine dental treatments, but it will also provide low-income households with spay/neuter services to combat animal overpopulation.

Surgery

\$150,000

All the stainless steel in this room is impressive! The surgery suite features the latest in veterinary technology. From spay/neuter surgeries to lifesaving amputations or sutures, lives will be saved every day in Surgery.

Animal Arrivals

\$100,000

The OHS staff greets animals and their human companions in the multi-purpose reception area. Patients from low-income families wait to see a veterinarian, and animals in need of a new home are also greeted in this area. Located directly off the busy entry lobby, this area, designed much like a private veterinary office, enables people to privately surrender an animal or seek veterinary care.

Treatment Area

\$100,000

Clinic patients and OHS animal residents receive quality medical care in this room. A wide variety of non-surgical procedures and medical tests will be conducted for thousands of animals each year.

Intensive Care Unit

\$100,000

Critically ill or injured animals, as well as post-surgical patients whose condition needs to be continuously monitored, are brought immediately to the ICU for treatment and observation.

Clinic Exam Room

\$50,000

Veterinarians will use this exam room to evaluate incoming animals. The rooms are fitted with state-of-the-art medical equipment to handle procedures from emergency examinations to preventative medicine.

Feline Recovery

\$50,000

Canine Recovery

\$50,000

Dogs and cats are placed in these recovery rooms to recuperate after spay/neuter surgery, or other medical treatments. This enables veterinary staff to continually monitor recuperating patients.



Feline Guest Lodging**\$50,000**

Cats spending time at OHS are held to observe their behavior and allow any disease that they may be carrying to be treated. Both areas of gleaming stainless steel house more than fifty cats in a safe, clean and comfortable environment. To minimize stress to the cats, their holding areas are not facing one another. The room has natural light, medical-quality air handling, soundproofing, and is visited regularly by staff and volunteers who begin the socialization and treatment process as soon as the cat arrives at the shelter.

Canine Guest Lodging**\$35,000**

All dogs who come to OHS spend quality time in Guest Lodging as they progress through the veterinary department and behavior department on their way to Dog Adoption. Each of the three wards house twelve dogs. The rooms have natural light, medical-quality air handling, soundproofing, and are visited regularly by staff and volunteers who will begin the socialization and treatment process as soon as the dog arrives at the shelter.

Radiology**\$30,000**

Just as in any animal hospital, staff members will use the radiology room to take X-rays of OHS animal residents and clinic patients. An X-ray machine is a critical instrument to make proper diagnoses of many medical injuries and conditions.

When cats, and dogs are brought into the shelter, a veterinarian first examines them. Those animals with contagious illnesses are kept in their own isolation area until they are healthy enough to live in the same room with other feline and canine guests.

Pharmacy**\$25,000**

Medications will be prepared and dispensed for OHS animal residents and clinic patients in the new pharmacy.

Animal Transformation**\$25,000**

This area is dedicated to animals brought in by the public for care. Some of these animals are strays, others are wild, and still others are domestic pets whose human companions can no longer care for them. Veterinary staff members will administer initial medical treatments to all new admissions in this busy room.

Veterinary Office Suite**\$10,000**

In this space, busy veterinary professionals return client phone calls, assist foster families in the care of OHS adoptable animals, direct training and veterinary management programs, as well as develop programs to improve the care of shelter animals.



Wildlife & Feral Cat Lodging**\$10,000**

This area is dedicated to wild animals and feral cats brought in by the public for immediate care. Wildlife will be transported to nearby Wildlife Rehabilitation Centers in the area.

Small Animal Lodging**\$10,000**

Petite pals like guinea pigs, rabbits and chinchillas are observed and medically treated in Small Animal Holding before they graduate to Small Animal Adoption.

Feline Food Preparation**\$10,000**

It's like a kitchen for kitties! OHS staff and volunteers will use this area to prepare daily feedings for felines in Guest Lodging.

Canine Food Preparation**\$10,000**

It's not too unlike your kitchen island at home! In this Preparation Area OHS staff and volunteers prepare daily feedings for animals residing in Guest Lodging.

Clinic Animals Food Preparation**\$10,000**

OHS staff and volunteers will use this area to prepare daily feedings for animals with contagious illnesses or who are under the care of our veterinarians. Separating this food area helps prevent disease transmission and ensure faster recoveries for animals suffering from illness.

X-Ray Dark Room**\$10,000**

This area is in the new fee-for-service clinic. The room is used by veterinarians and their assistants to develop the X-rays taken in the radiology room.

Clinic Prep Area**\$10,000**

Veterinarians and other staff use this area to prepare animals for surgeries and pre-surgical treatments .

Rovers' Records**\$10,000**

Nope, we're not talking LPs. Medical histories of animals cared for by OHS are kept in this room for easy access by clinic staff.

Canine Cleaners**\$10,000**

Although Fido may not be trained to do laundry, this sure is a hoppin' place! OHS goes through many sheets, towels, and other laundry in one day. Laundry is done constantly. The laundry at the new facility will be more industrially suited for the task at hand, and easier for staff to use.



Pooch Personality Profiling**\$25,000**

The Wisconsin Humane Society has pioneered an extensive dog evaluation process designed to understand the unique personality of each dog who comes to a shelter. The evaluation process was developed to help make the right, long term match for a dog and his or her future guardian. The Dog Evaluation Room at OHS will be specially equipped to aid staff in making an assessment of each shelter dog's type of personality. One-way glass is used by the staff to observe dogs in the more life-like setting of the evaluation room.

Feline Fun Room**\$5,000**

In addition to being a quiet, private area for evaluating a cat's personality, this room will also be used as a playroom for cats. Many cat socialization volunteers help entertain cats at the shelter by providing stimulating play time and toys, not to mention lots of TLC.

Individualized Canine Guest Lodging**\$1,000 each**

Dogs will each have their own kennel with a warm, soft bed, and a space to exercise and play with their toys. Regularly visited by volunteers inviting them to take a walk, the dogs are made very comfortable in their temporary digs.

Individual Feline Guest Lodging**\$1,000 each**

Cats have a quiet, safe spot to curl up on their own little rugs with their toys. They receive regular visitors in these clean, cozy cages.

Doggie Day Spa**\$25,000**

Just like people, dogs look and feel better after a good grooming. In addition, studies and experience have shown that animals who are well-groomed stand a better chance to be adopted than animals who are not groomed.





Education Center

Educational Center

\$500,000

The Education Department plays an important role in ending pet overpopulation and animal cruelty, as well as providing training and behavior information that helps people maintain the human/animal bond. The OHS Education Department will now have space – a beautiful, light-filled classroom – to offer seminars, Scout outings, day camp and other educational programs and services.

Wetland Walk

\$25,000

Meandering through the native wetlands just north of the building, the Wetland Walk will be a joy for dogs out on their daily strolls around the shelter. Careful construction and maintenance of the walk will ensure the preservation of native plant and animal species.

Wetland Overlook

\$120,000

This handsome patio area will be used primarily as an educational tool to educate adults and children about the surrounding wetland habitat. Vibrant displays will engage visitors to learn about the myriad of species that inhabit the wetland and the conservation and preservation of our natural resources will be explored. This area will also be the site for special events, outdoor seminars and fun activities.

Outside Agility Course

\$25,000

The new Ozaukee Humane Society site is located on 3.5-acre lot. Dog guardians will love the equipment and outdoor area for the summer agility program. Both formal and informal agility program options will be available to the community.

Rainwater recovery containers will collect rainfall for irrigation, acoustic privacy, as a heat sink or recovery, or for aesthetic pleasure. These environmentally sustainable features are educational in themselves, as well!
